Pledging a legacy

There are several ways in which a legacy can be made:

- **A pecuniary legacy**
A gift of a fixed sum of money or percentage of your estate.
- **A residuary legacy**
You give the remainder of your estate (or a percentage) after all the other bequests to friends and family have been distributed and all outgoings have been dealt with.
- **A specific legacy**
A gift of personal property; this can be in the form of shares, property or valuables such as works of art.
- **A reversionary legacy**
You leave your assets to trustees so that family or other beneficiaries can enjoy the income during their lifetime, with all or a portion of the capital going to Gayhurst after your death.
- **A substitutional/ conditional legacy**
A gift of your estate to other persons which reverts to the school if they predecease you.

If you have already written your Will and do not wish to rewrite the whole document you may consider adding a codicil.

Please be advised:

- Do not make alterations to the original document as this will invalidate your will.
- A codicil can alter, omit or add anything to your existing will.
- Codicils must be witnessed in the same way as a normal will, but does not need to be the same witness as your original will.

Please note this document is not intended to be a substitute for legal advice, and we recommend that those wishing to leave a legacy to Gayhurst School take professional advice.

Gayhurst School Trust is a registered charity and therefore any bequest will be free of inheritance tax. Under current legislation, if you leave 10% or more of your chargeable net estate to charity, the Inheritance Tax rate on your whole estate will reduce from 40% to 36%.
